The Namibia Nature Foundation has a well establish Environmental Economics programme and we have secured a consortium bidding for a MET/GIZ TEEB Country Study on Protected Areas and Wildlife. As part of our accepted bid we are looking to engage two Namibian ***Environmental Economics Trainees***.

The positions are scheduled to run from March to August 2017.

Key requirements

- You must be a recent graduate of a Masters or Honours degree in economics, or about to graduate, but be available fulltime for the period indicated above.
- You must be available full-time from March-August 2017
- You must be able to demonstrate an interest in conservation, the environment and natural resource management.
- You must be able to demonstrate a good knowledge of data handling and analysis; experience with SPSS, STATA or other forms of statistical software is an advantage.
- You must have good inter-personal skills, including the ability to develop professional relationships at all levels with local communities, government agencies, the not-for-profit sector and the scientific community.
- Excellent report writing and communications skills in English.
- Command of other local languages would be an advantage.
- Experience with surveys or eco-system valuation methods, particularly contingent valuation, is an advantage.
